NEW ENROLLMENT FOR APA

The 2024-2025 sibling and transfer applications are now available! We encourage you to apply ASAP as our lotteries will begin in January. We have made changes to our application process for new siblings.

Siblings: If you have a sibling student you would like to apply for, please do so at https://www.americanprep.org/tours/. You will register for a time to bring your prospective student to the school for a brief meeting. You will not be required to tour the school, however, your application will not enter the lottery until this step is complete! Do not delay this step as it will delay your application process.

With the winter season we would like to take a moment to remind you of our illness policy:

In case of illness at school, students will come to the school office. School staff will contact parents if they deem it is necessary. Students who are ill (fever, vomiting, excessive or productive coughing, runny nose and/or eyes) must be picked up immediately from school. If a parent cannot be reached, the emergency contact listed on the student enrollment form will be notified to come and pick up the student. If a student feels ill but there are no obvious symptoms of illness, the school secretary may, after conferring with the parent, invite the student to rest in the school office for 10 to 15 minutes to determine if the symptoms will subside. If the student is not feeling better after this time, the parents will be contacted again and will need to pick up the student.
